

King County Democratic Central Committee:

January 27, 2009

The King County Democratic Central Committee endorsed Sherril Huff for Elections Director by acclamation at its January 28 meeting at the Carpenters Hall in Renton, after Huff had made the case for her election to committee members.

The KCDCC also heard from County Council member Larry Phillips, hours after he had announced his candidacy for King County Executive, and from Port of Seattle Commissioner Gael Tarleton, Craig Salins of Washington Public Campaigns, and Stacie Anderson, Congressman Adam Smith's new political director (a 34th District resident).

County chair Susan Sheary introduced the new King County elected and appointed officers, the new Legislative District chairs, and the newly elected (or re-elected) County Committee members from the respective Legislative Districts.

The Central Committee heard reports from KCDCC Treasurer Andrew Peabody, and from the Legislative Action Committee, Endorsements Committee, Candidate Recruitment Committee, State Committee, and Affirmative Action Committee.

KCDCC second-vice chair Joel Ware presented a resolution to support House Bill 1738, which provides for public financing of state Supreme Court races. The resolution passed by acclamation.
