## My Life

My life has been one of a progressive, non-conforming, non-traditional, active citizen. After graduating from Summit High School here in Seattle in 1978, I needed to make a choice on my future path. There were policies, and a long line of incredible leaders, that helped make my choice possible and build the culture in Seattle where I would thrive.

The successful efforts of the Civil Rights movement and the Anti-War protests of the 1960's and early 1970's created the awareness, on a national level, of a clear need for greater social and economic justice in the awarding of federal contracts using public tax payer dollars. The policy our government created was Affirmative Action. Evolving law stated a goal that 5% of the federal contracting dollar shall go to socially and economically disadvantaged entrepreneurs.

Additionally, Washington State has always been a leader in federal defense contracting. Our naval shipyards, aerospace industry, and transportation networks are in part funded through federal dollars.

With the new policy in place, by the mid 1970's unions could no longer afford to defend their mono-racial, mono-gender, training and hiring programs. By 1980, all major trade unions opened their apprenticeships to non-traditional applicants and my career path was born. In 1997 private interests actively opposed Affirmative Action by funding Tim Eyman's original initiative campaign, I-200, which won the popular vote. The struggle for justice is endless.

I am certain that my 33 year career as a non-traditional member of the skilled construction building trades was made possible by the hard fought gains of all the social and economic justice leaders. They convinced our elected officials that the road to a stable and strong USA must include a diverse work force.

Every city and community in the U.S. has benefited from the implementation of Affirmative Action, whether we choose to believe it or not. I am eternally grateful for all leadership struggles that create greater justice and equality in our lives.

## KCDCC Report

The main business of this meeting was the Candidates Forum. The first candidate up was Bob Ferguson, who is running for Attorney General. He is a proponent of consumer protections and will work hard to protect homeowners from unscrupulous foreclosure practices. Asked about the BIAW being over-compensated by the state and not giving the money back, he remarked that his opponent was endorsed by the BIAW. If state law allows, he would compel the BIAW to pay back to the state what they owe.

Kathleen Drew and Zack Hudgins are candidates for Secretary of State. Kathleen Drew is the author of State's Ethics in Public Service Law. Asked about the Top Two Primary, she explained that it is currently the law and she is not too concerned about it. She supports PCO elections, but is interested in looking at having elections in contested PCO races only. She will work to make elections more accessible to non-English speaking people and wants to keep precinct size manageable.

Zack Hudgins is the Chair of the House Government Oversight Committee. He is concerned about the suppression of voters' rights. In this last election cycle over 21,000 ballots were not mailed; this problem needs to be fixed. He spoke against the Top Two Primary and sponsored a bill to have closed primaries and supports making voting more accessible to non-English speaking people.

Mark Miloscia is running for State Auditor. In his professional life he has been a performance auditor. As state Auditor he will champion a working government. Based on his analysis it would take six years to show us results.

Alison Holcomb spoke about Yes on I-502, the marijuana initiative. They are close to reaching their goal of signatures.

Akilah Stewart, a member of the 37th LD Dems, spoke on behalf of Occupy Seattle. When asked about any efforts to register the OS members to vote, she indicated that there was no voter registration drive and, in fact, many of them have never voted. They do have an educational tent set up where people are free to learn about a variety of things.

The body voted to cancel the December meeting, with only one vote against.

In committee reports, it was reported that we now have 975 PCOs in King County which is a 12 month increase of 156. We are making great progress in multi-cultural outreach. Sarajane Seigfriedt reported that she could use a few more people on the Platform Committee. Steve Zemke emphasized that our committees could use more members and chairs. If interested, please contact him.

## How'd We Do?

On the left is a table showing the results of the November 8 election as of that night. King County Elections presents an abstract on their website of the results that includes the legislative districts for election night only. If we wanted the certified results, we would have to pay for them. Since the results are for the same timeframe, the comparison should be pretty close to the final. In order to have the election night results for the State, one must check the Secretary of State's website before the next day's changes or they're gone (which I didn't do), but only the initiatives were state-wide.

It seems that people in the 34th District were feeling pretty stingy about paying taxes, although the Family and Education Levy did get a slight majority, but the \$60 Car Tab was a definite No, a more than 10% higher No than the rest of the city.

One interesting difference between the 34th District and the rest of Seattle is in the School Board District 6 race. Steve Sundquist, on election night, was actually winning against Marty McLaren in the 34th while Marty was ahead in the rest of the city. Steve has been a member of our district for several years and is well-known and well-liked in our area, and Marty was relatively unknown. But she worked hard and was the only School Board challenger to lead from the beginning to the end.


