Message from the Chairman

Endorsements and the “Pachyderm Principle”

From all over King County, candidates for both partisan and nonpartisan races praised the 34th District Democrats’ candidate forum held June 13. We asked some pointed, substantive questions, some of which we considered “hardball,” and the candidates were up to answering them.

Now we’ll see if those answers were good enough or not, at our endorsement meeting July 11.

The endorsement rules, and the sections of our bylaws that pertain to endorsements, are posted on our Web site, and will be available to members and guests in hard copy form at the July meeting. The membership approved them at the June meeting, so they are not negotiable. If candidates have not complied with all of these provisions by the call to order for the July meeting, motions to endorse them will be ruled out of order.

The Executive Board and I take endorsements and our endorsement process very seriously, and we hope that you do, too.

We have tried to make an endorsement by the 34th District Democrats something to be sought, and not gained automatically, nor without effort. Candidates will have one, and only one, opportunity to be endorsed at the July meeting. There will be no second or third ballots—just one. Candidates who fall short of a two-thirds vote will not be endorsed. Those who are endorsed will have worked for it, just like we want them to. A “D” besides your name is NOT all it takes.

Most candidates get this. They expend the effort to campaign in our District as a result, and respect our process.

But some don’t, and here’s an example from this year’s campaign. These are not hypothetical cases.

We have in the 34th District two present candidates for re-election to different positions, both members of our organization. Both are unopposed. Candidate A has been all over the place campaigning for votes, citing the need to keep campaigning and facing the

Marcee Stone Named President of Washington Public Campaigns

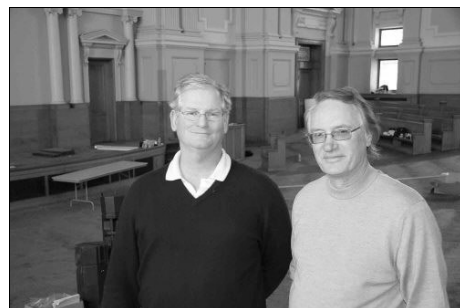
34th District PCO Marcee Stone is passionate about changing our campaign financing system to one that takes the power from corporations and puts it in the hands of the people. She has been involved in Washington Public Campaigns practically from the beginning and was recently elected President of the organization. She has a BFA from the University of Washington in Drama which may contribute to her comfort with the audience. She was Chair of the Parent Education Program for Seattle Academy Parent Association and organized speaking events. She has worked in legal administration for many years.

Three bills to provide for public financing of campaigns were sent to the legislature, one of them sponsored by Joe McDermott, but none of them passed. Washington Public Campaigns has decided that the best way is to bring the matter to the people.

To qualify for public funding a candidate would collect signatures and a small donation from a set number of voters in his or her district. The candidate would receive a specific amount from the state based on amounts spent in similar races in the past, but must refuse all contributions from other sources. If an opponent raised more money than the set amount, the publicly-funded candidate would receive more funds, thus leveling the playing field.

Dan Fievez Needs \$100,000 to Buy a Church

Actually, the \$100,000 is the down payment for the First Church of Christ Scientist, an acoustically as well as architecturally magnificent church built in 1906. The building was sold to Joe Soecette, a local developer who has plans to develop the church into luxury condominiums. As an official city landmark, the exterior cannot be touched, but what happens to the interior is another story. The church organ and the pews have been removed, but the interior of the church is untouched, at least for now. Dan Fievez, who loves opera as much as he loves beautiful women, thinks it would be a perfect performing arts center. What he envisions is a diverse arts center that a variety of musical organizations could call home. Surprisingly, the owner agrees with Dan and is listening, but points out that he has invested quite a bit of money and he could get a demolition permit almost immediately. He's willing to sell but time is running out.

Getting the down payment is the hard part. Dan says that the larger financing needed to buy the church would be a quicker process than getting the earnest money. One bank has provided him with a letter acknowledging its interest and stating that the project and its financial requirements are within the scope of what the bank can and wants to do. The building is in Frank Chopp's district and he is supportive of the project as is our senator, Erik Poulsen.

We're in the West Seattle Herald

Our candidate forum is always one of our best meetings of the year and this year was no exception. Over 100 people attended and we made the front page of the West Seattle Herald. It was a long, complimentary article. It's not available on the newsstands anymore, but you can check the website if you haven't already seen it. There is a link to it on 34dems.org.

One question that was asked of several of the candidates was, "Have you ever voted for a candidate who was not a Democrat?" It turns out that quite a few of us have something to hide. Venus Valazquez admitted that she voted for Ronald Reagan, an extreme error in judgment, the audience noted. She was forgiven when she explained that she was only eighteen and she would never ever do it again. Al Runte voted for Jacob Javits when he lived in New York. But even one of our most partisan members, who shall remain nameless, not only voted for John Spellman against Dixie Lee Ray, but is proud of it and would do it again.

Dow Constantine has run four times out of the last six elections and this time he just might have something to worry about. He has a Democratic opponent, or at least someone who is a Democrat this time around: Michael Goodspaceguy Nelson. Unfortunately he did not attend the forum so we were unable to get more information on his idea for human settlements on other planets. Even before being asked, Dow gave this answer to the inevitable question: "I don't have a position on the colonization of space." Well, that's certainly good to hear.

34th District member and Seattle City Councilman Tom Rasmussen is unopposed but came to the forum anyway. When asked why he was even bothering to campaign since he's already won de facto reelection, he replied that he wanted to be accountable and accessible. And we all know he always has been.

KCDCC Report

Candidates for current positions spoke to the audience. Keith Scully and Bill Sherman spoke at length to their individual merits for King County Prosecuting Attorney, emphasizing the importance of having a Democrat in the position to make needed changes and how those changes would affect the way law enforcement is handled in King County and further in Washington State. The KCDCC endorsement meeting is scheduled for July.

An 8th Congressional District Democratic organization has been formed. Tina Shamseldin announced an LAC meeting for the 3rd Sunday, 2 to 4 p.m. in the 36th LD. Brad Larssen, from the 45th LD, was endorsed as a write in candidate for the King County Council District 6 seat. Office and committee reports were briefly presented, notably the finance committee; the Central Committee is short on funds and an invitation was issued for more members and donations. Kelly Larson is a new member of the WSDCC research staff, investigating congressional accountability. The Citizens Election Options committee discussed Dwight Pelz' 6/26 statement re: Diebold on Washblog.

Two resolutions passed: one on reinstating habeas corpus and one on campaign financing reform.

Land Commissioner from the 34th District?

According to an article in the Seattle P-I, which you may or may not have seen, two of our favorites, Senator Erik Poulsen and King County Councilman Dow Constantine, have said that they're thinking about entering the race for Land Commissioner. Also in the running is Peter Goldmark who impressed us all when he ran against US Representative Cathy Morris.

In our district, expansion of mining on Maury Island is an important issue. Dow Constantine is quoted as saying that Sutherland has "demonstrated a lack of interest in the environmental challenges facing Puget Sound. The particular issue that is really getting my gall has been the Maury Island Gravel Mine. The commissioner has made plenty of room for a proposed gravel mine and dock, which is at odds with the purposes that the Maury Island reserve was established for."

Erik Poulsen said that his work creating the Puget Sound Partnership and as lead negotiator in breaking the 30-year impasse over Columbia River water will likely stand out if he decides to run for office.

Any of these three would be a good choice to run against Doug Sutherland, a pro-industry Republican.
