



How Will CD Caucus Delegates and Alternates Be Nominated and Elected?

Start

Sign in and receive credentials

Credentials are a confirmation you are a LD Caucus Delegate and you have the right to vote. Alternates will be credentialed in place of absent delegates. Unless seated as a delegate, Alternates cannot vote.

At 10:00 am we will convene the caucus with a call to order.

At 11:45 am, we will break into sub-caucuses and the nomination and election process will begin.

If current percentages hold, there will be 4 sub-caucuses by candidate and congressional district; one for Obama and one for Clinton in both the 7th and 9th Congressional Districts.

Any registered voter living in the 34th District who considers themselves to be a Democrat may run for CD Delegate or Alternate. Only credentialed LD Delegates are allowed to vote.

The first 60 minutes will be the nominating process. You will lobby LD Delegates to nominate you as a CD Delegate by collecting as many nominating cards as you can.

Credentialed LD Delegates have 10 nominating cards that they can give to people running for CD Caucus Delegate or Alternate. They can give all 10 cards to one person or one card to 10 people or any combination.

The Tally Committee was appointed by the 34th District Democrats and includes representatives from both campaigns to ensure fairness.

The 34th District Democrats Tally Committee will collect and count the number of cards you have.

The Tally Committee will create ballots with the names of the LD Delegates that received the highest number of nomination cards. The names on the ballots will be sorted by gender and then by the number of nominating cards received in descending order.

The number of delegates on the ballot will be a combination of the required CD Delegates and CD Alternates for that sub-caucus. **This means if you are nominated and placed on the ballot, you will either be a CD Delegate or Alternate.**

Do you want to be elected as a CD Caucus Delegate?

Depending on how many people show up, there could be over 700 hundred LD Delegates in your sub-caucus who have 10 nominating cards they COULD give to you.

You must collect nomination cards from other delegates. You only have 60 minutes to collect cards on April 5th. Think about:

- Building alliances in advance.
- Gaining support in advance.
- Having having friends help you collect cards that day.
- How to make yourself visible that day.
- A quick statement you could used to convince people to give you their cards.

**You are running a campaign!!!!
Be Creative!!**

Candidates will have up to one minute each to speak. This will be in the order they appear on the ballot alternating male and female.

You are speaking to earn enough votes to become a delegate as opposed to an alternate.

Seated credentialed LD Delegates will vote for CD Caucus Delegates and Alternates.

You must vote for the exact number of CD Delegates your subcaucus is allotted and sign your ballot for it to be counted.

The Tally Committee will count the votes. The people with the highest votes will be the CD Caucus Delegates and the remaining candidates will be alternates in the order of votes received.

In the event of a tie, the decision will be made by lot.
