

# The Path to Justice for Immigrants

Many immigrants coming to the U.S. to work are economic refugees fleeing from conditions created by corporate-friendly trade deals that ravage farmers, workers and small business owners around the world. Undocumented immigrants contribute mightily to our economy, yet they are treated as criminals, arrested in ICE raids and held in federally funded, privately managed detention facilities, or deported with no consideration for the impact their deportation may have on their family and friends, both here and back home.

U.S. Unions have been slow to respond to this crisis. OWLS produced an Immigrant Rights Resolution which has been adopted by the Washington State Labor Council. The Resolution calls for: an end to ICE raids; amnesty for families living in the U.S.; and an immigration policy that upholds family reunification, equal protection of workers' rights regardless of immigration status, and full civil liberty protections for immigrant workers.
