Message from the Chairman

In 2004, we experienced an exciting, empowering outpouring of citizen activism when we packed our precinct and District caucuses with determined, committed Democrats.

We hit the streets, banged the doors, and manned the phones. We stuffed envelopes and wrote checks. We punched data into computers, and—most important—we engaged our neighbors.

We did our jobs in the 34th District and in Washington State. The 34th had an 85 percent turnout and the District voted 72 percent Democratic. The rest of the country did not do as well, as we know, and therefore our work is not finished.

Precinct caucuses are upon us again, and once again we issue the call to action. We must turn out and show our muscle. The stakes go higher with every day Bush is in office.

The right wing has Washington in its sights. We have Maria Cantwell's Senate seat to hold, a possible pickup in the House in the Eighth District, and we need to keep the Legislature in Democratic hands to strengthen Governor Gregoire's re-election bid in 2008—not to mention the Presidential election.

Again we issue the call for Precinct Committee Officers. If your precinct does not have one, please consider stepping up. If a precinct near you is vacant, please consider stepping in.

It might be easy to claim political fatigue from all the calls to action. We all have lives, after all. We have families to feed, bills to pay, jobs to do. But I think we all might agree that the going is getting tough. You know the rest of that saying.

Housing—in our neighborhoods—is on the agenda for the February meeting. Velma Veloria, former Democratic State Representative from our neighboring 11th District, will bring us up to date on the activities in White Center of the International District Housing Alliance, which she now represents.

Adrienne Quinn, Director of the City of Seattle Office of Housing and a 34th District Democrats member, will brief us on her office's efforts to maintain affordable housing in Seattle.

Anne Eudoxie Francisce

Anne Francisce was an active member of the 34th District Democrats for around ten years and for several years was our King County Committeewoman. She stopped attending meetings around two years ago, but when her newsletter was returned and her phone disconnected, many of us wondered what had happened to her. I am sorry to report that, thanks to a little detective work from Cherisse Luxa, we now know that Anne passed away about a year ago.

She was born in Belgium in 1930 and moved to Los Angeles, where she taught school, in 1963. She received a MA in Political Science from the University of Southern California in 1967. She moved to Seattle to continue her studies at the University of Washington and taught Conversational French at Bellevue Community College.

In 1981 she converted to Islam and became a passionate supporter of the rights of Muslims. She presented many resolutions in support of Palestinians, and Muslims in other countries as well. We passed most of them and some we didn't.

Anne was an amazing person who I think most of us never really knew. She was very well educated, and in 1973 she wrote a book, *The problems of minorities in the nation-building process; The Kurds, the Copts, the Berbers*. She graduated as a Certified Ayurvedic Practitioner from an intensive training program at Bastyr when she was in her 70's, a time when most of us would think that it was time to take a rest. She studied Arabic in Egypt after converting to Islam. Anne was a passionate person who added energy to our meetings. We've missed her.

Ester was a new member of the 34th District Democrats who just last month began helping out with the mailing of this newsletter. We were just getting to know her and are sorry to hear of her passing three days after suffering a massive stroke. We will miss her.

Howard Dean will be there along with Governor Christine Gregoire, Congressmen Baird, Smith, Inslee and McDermott and many other special guests. The cost is \$40 and \$10 for children 12 and under.

KCDCC Report

The majority of the January 24 meeting was taken up with a panel of candidates for the chair of the Washington State Democratic Central Committee (WSDCC). Present were Dwight Pelz, Bill Harrington, Jean Brooks, Laura Ruderman and Mark Hintz. After introductory remarks, the candidates fielded questions from the audience. Here is a summary of a couple of the questions and the individual responses:

What are the top two changes you would make in the WSDCC?

Dwight: ask candidates to talk about class, particularly the middle class; create more face time, door-to-door contact.

Bill: invite district chairs and vice chairs to talk about how to get more people to caucuses; move state primary to June.

Mark: develop PCO grassroots, invigorate the base; set long term goals, where are we going what is our vision?

Laura: stop writing off parts of the state, support eastern Washington; make sure volunteers feel valued.

Jean: build strong grass roots throughout state, all politics are local; offer training and support, "look at systems"

How would you reach out to people of color?

Dwight: get them more involved in party; get them to run as candidates; register them to vote.

Mark: begin with outreach, create a committee for diversity.

Laura: identify subtle racism and sexism, don't perpetuate; promote people of color and women to positions of authority.

Jean: create voting positions that represent minority community.

Bill: challenging question, reach out, care, listen

There was much other discussion. This is just a flavor. The election is scheduled for January 28. [Dwight Pelz was elected]

In other business, Tina Shamseldin, Legislative Action Committee Chair, noted that the legislative session is moving along quickly. Bills are in a critical stage. She mentioned the following bills that could use support: the bill that would change school levies to simple majority votes for passage; an alternative process to passing the WASL for graduation, which needs help in appropriations (HB 2582); Fair Share which would require large employers like Wal-Mart to take responsibility for providing basic, affordable health insurance to their employees; and environmental bills that are being fought by businesses, including HB 1488 which would prohibit the sale of certain flame retardants. She also mentioned a bill that would prohibit unethical practices by credit card companies. The latter has not yet been endorsed by the KCDCC.

Minutes of 34th District Democrats Meeting of January 11, 2006

Chair Ivan Weiss brought the meeting to order at 7:04 PM. King County Councilmember Dow Constantine led the membership in the flag salute. The agenda and minutes of November meeting were approved.

Jean Brooks, Bill Harrington, Mark Hintz, Dwight Pelz and Laura Ruderman are campaigning for the position of state party chair. The State Committee will elect a chair to replace Paul Berendt on January 28.

Tim Nuse and Kathy Minsch attended the Washington Environmental Council (www.wecprotects.org) conference. Kathy Minsch stated that Tim is organizing a January 26 trip to Olympia to lobby for the top five environmental action priorities of the Council. Members interested in this trip should sign up with Tim Nuse.

The King County Legislative Action committee is meeting on January 15 at the Burien library. All Democrats are welcome to attend. Toni Lysen said the LAC is building a telephone tree and e-mail list for contacting elected officials during the legislative session. Former Governor Booth Gardner may speak.

Martin Luther King's birthday celebration is Monday January 16. A major rally at Garfield High School and march to downtown Seattle is planned. The 34th will be marching with PCO Dina Johnson leading - members interested in marching should talk to Dina.

Weiss introduced the 34th District officers and the elected officials present: Dow Constantine, Lucy Krakowiak and Joe McDermott who drove up from Olympia tonight to be with us even though the legislative session started this week. Weiss also acknowledged Jack Arends, PCO and State Committeeman from the 33rd District.

PCO Linda Johnson told members that the League of Women Voters appreciates past donations the 34th has made to help publish "They Represent You" (TRY). Johnson also announced a LWV marriage equality forum on February 15 in Bellevue (seattle.wa.lwv.org/events.asp). On February 12 the League is sponsoring a concert at Fautleroy Church to raise money for a number of nonprofit organizations including Family Promise.

Chair Weiss introduced Representative Adam Smith of the 9th Congressional District. Smith believes the real issue in this year's election is: do you want to give George Bush more power? If not, vote Democratic. Democrats have ideas and courage, and are a viable alternative to the Republicans now in power. Weiss announced a fundraiser for Smith on January 19 at Mick Kelly's Irish Pub.

Our main speaker, Verlene Jones, directs the Union Cities program of the King County Labor Council. Jones talked about "what a union is" (it is "U" or YOU). She recounted some recent successes of union organizing and cited a number of important functions performed by unions on behalf of workers and citizens.

Chair Weiss introduced Litsa Buffington, a flight attendant with Northwest Airlines with 40 years service. The airline is in bankruptcy and is trying to void its union contracts. Buffington introduced the concept of an "airline workers bill of rights" and asked members to sign and support it.

Alan Munro moved to endorse Russ Brubaker for appointment to the one-year City Council term to replace Jim Compton. Susan Harmon stated that she has also applied for this position and asked for endorsement. Cherisse Luxa asked, since this is not an election but an appointment, if the bylaws allowed for an endorsement. Chair Weiss ruled that the endorsement motion was in order. The motion to endorse Brubaker passed.

Tanya Aguilar moved to endorse Javier Valdez for this position. Valdez is a member of the 34th District although not a resident of the District. Valdez was not present but Aguilar spoke on his behalf. The motion failed.

Lucy Krakowiak moved endorsement of Susan Harmon. The vote was: Aye - 30. Nay - 20. The motion failed.

Lynn Davison from Vashon spoke about the upcoming vote on creation of a hospital district on Vashon. If the district were created, five commissioners would be elected. The district would have the power to levy a property tax to maintain basic healthcare services. A hospital would not necessarily be built. Leslie Harris moved the district endorse this measure. The motion passed.

Oanh Meyers, candidate for hospital commissioner District #5 on Vashon Island spoke. Patrick Wicklund moved to endorse Meyers. The motion passed.

Fourteen Precinct Committee Officers were appointed, seven from Vashon Island: Ellen Kritzman - Biloxi; Robert Murano - Cove; Dennis Saunders - Cross; Ronald Irvine - Chautauqua; Gayle Sommers - Tahlequah; Mark Meyers - Dilworth; Vickie Mercer - Dolphin; Steven Butts - 1539; Terri Robison - Regal; Joe Grande - 1455; Susan Harmon - 1512; Keith Weir - Acting in 0699; Kari-Lynn Frank - 1466; Margaret Swan - 1245.

Chair Weiss entertained nominations for the position of King County Committeewoman Alternate. State Committeewoman Leslie Harris nominated PCO Cherisse Luxa. The motion passed.

Bruce Stotler moved that the District send \$200 to the League of Women Voters to help defray the cost of They Represent You brochures. The motion passed.

Meeting adjourned 9:15 PM.

Precinct Caucuses—March 4

The caucuses will be held on Saturday, March 4 at 2:00. If you live in Seattle, check the list below and look for your precinct to find where your caucus is being held. Sealth High School is located at 2600 Thistle Street SW, Madison Middle School is located at 3429 45th Ave SW, and High Point Community Center is located at 6920 34th Ave SW. If you don't know your precinct, look above your name on the newsletter mailing label. If you live on Vashon, your caucus will be held at McMurray School, 9329 Cemetery Road. If you live in Burien (Precincts with BUR 34 prefixes) or White Center (named, not numbered precincts), your precinct will be held at Cascade Middle School, 11212 10th Ave SW.

The caucus will start at 2:00 with all the precincts in your area forming as a group. If there is time you will be able to discuss any issues that attendees think should be addressed in the County or State platforms. At 2:30 you will break out into your own precinct caucus where you will vote for delegates to both the 34th District Caucus and the King County Convention. If you are a PCO, you are automatically a delegate. This is in addition to the number allotted to your precinct and an additional alternate may be chosen. In other words, if your precinct is allotted four delegates, you will be the fifth delegate and an additional alternate may be chosen for a total of five. After delegates are chosen, but not before 3:00, you will return to the area caucus to finish discussion about issues. Delegates to the State Convention in Yakima will be elected at the District Caucus.

If you can't make it to the caucus and want to be a delegate, just state in writing that your wish to be a delegate or alternate, that you are a Democrat and that you are willing to be known as a Democrat, and that you will serve if elected, and make sure your written statement gets to the caucus. Simply signing this statement does not make you a delegate, though. You still need to be elected.

Remember, this is true grassroots politics—your chance to let your opinion be known.
