At this caucus, the precinct level delegates will likely choose 38 delegates and 19 Alternates to go to the State Convention (May 1st and the 7th Congressional District Caucus (May 21st). All delegates and alternates will be contacted with more information as soon as possible.

Our April 13th meeting will feature a candidate forum for Lieutenant Governor, Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and State Auditor. We will also have a feedback session on the Precinct Caucus and a preview of the Legislative District Caucus.




# **Treasurer's Report**

# In Case You Missed Our Last Meeting . . .

The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m., just after the PCO caucus training. Most of those attending the training stayed for the meeting; that, along with the many candidates attending, made for a much larger crowd than usual.

In her Treasurer's report, Karen Chilcutt reported our beginning balance on February was \$25,315. We received \$1,767 in revenue, mostly from membership dues. Expenses were \$15,969, including \$10,561 for printing caucus materials.

Marcee asked for volunteers to help with the caucuses and for PCO volunteers.

Conor Bronsdon spoke about the Save SODO group and asked for volunteers to attend the City Council meeting to comment about the plan for a new basketball/hockey stadium.

In her Chair Report, Marcee said that she had trained nearly 100 people for the caucuses. We then watched a video of the democratic caucus process and how to become a delegate. Many of our members have been working behind the scenes to make the caucuses work smoothly. She thanked Steve Butts for his work on the caucus flyer.

We heard from several candidates: Erin Jones is running for Superintendent of Public Instruction. She is the first black woman to run for statewide office. David Keenan is running for King County Superior Court, Department 26, Judge Steve Rosen is running for King County Superior `Court Department 33; Eric Newman is running for King County Superior Court, Department 44; Judge Johanna Bender is running for her current position, King County Superior Court, Department 21; John McHale, King County Superior Court, Department 43; Nicole Gaines Phelps, King County Superior Department 14. All the above candidates are running unopposed. Later in the meeting, Mike Heavey moved that we endorse all the judges in the above list. This passed unanimously.

Chris Langler moved that we endorse Tina Podlodowski who is running for Secretary of State. The motion and endorsement of Tina Podlodowski passed unanimously,

#### Report from KCDCC Meeting of March 29, 2016

A recommendation from the Endorsements Committee brought forth the nomination and endorsement of Tina Podlodowski for Secretary of State.

The bulk of the meeting centered on introductory speeches from candidates. First up were candidates for the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI).

**Robin Fleming**, a school nurse, returned to school to obtain a PhD in Educational Leadership and Policy Studies from the U of W, and is currently the health services program administrator at the OSPI.

**Erin Jones**, raised in The Netherlands, has 25 years in education as a teacher, the last three as the Assistant Superintendent of Student Achievement at OSPI. She would like to see only 4 hours of standardized testing per year.

Larry Seaquist, a retired US Naval Officer lives in Gig Harbor. He pointed to his electoral success running as a progressive in a red area. He wants to define the cost of our state's obligation to fully fund education and press for tax reform to fund it, without relying on local levies.

All three candidates are against charter schools and the current required amount of state and federal testing.

**Representative Chris Reykdal**, a State Rep. from Tumwater is also an OSPI candidate and was scheduled to speak, but needed to remain in Olympia to take final session votes.

Since the original meeting agenda was light, there was time to hear from candidates running for King County Superior Court positions: Johanna Bender (Dept. 28), Nicole Gaines-Phelps (Dept. 14), David Keenan (Dept. 26), John McHale (Dept. 43), Eric Newman (Dept. 44) and Steve Rosen (Dept. 33).

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Finance:** Jayson Morris, a PCO and Executive Board member in the 36 LD, has agreed to be the Treasurer for the KCDCC, and was elected to that position.

Outreach: The Teen Feed program will be losing the Rainier Beach location, which may be picked up by an area church. A Kinship Resource Fair will be held April 23 and the Rainier Beach Community Center for parents and relatives raising children, and it is hoped KCDCC will have a voter registration table there.

**Elections:** Volunteers are wanted to oversee the April 26 special election ballot processing.

LAC: The March meeting featured visits from 48<sup>th</sup> LD State Rep. Patty Kuderer and 5<sup>th</sup> LD State Rep. candidate Darcy Burner. The April meeting time and location is has not yet been announced.

New Business was an appeal from the group "Save SoDo", asking us to contact the Seattle City Council to ask that they vote not to prematurely vacate a portion of Occidental Ave. S. in anticipation of a possible basketball arena.

### **Caucuses and Conventions**

The state party estimates that a record number of Democrats attended their precinct caucuses in Washington: approximately 230,000. enthusiastic Democrats. Those elected as delegates or alternates will go on to the Legislative District Caucus and to the King County Convention

# Legislative District Caucus and King County Convention

The 34th legislative district caucus will be held on Sunday, April 17 at 1:00 p.m. at West Seattle High School. Delegates to the Congressional District Caucuses and the State Convention will be elected.

The King County convention will be held on Sunday, May 1 at 1:00 p.m. Resolutions and Platform are discussed and approved at the convention.

The Congressional District Caucuses will be held on Saturday, May 21. Six women and six men from the 7th Congressional District will be elected to attend the national convention, and one presidential elector and one alternate.

The Washington State Convention will be held in Tacoma on Friday, June 17 to Sunday, June 19. The convention is always a lot of fun, and while you must be a delegate in order to vote, you do do not have to be a delegate to attend. The remaining presidential electors will be elected, the state party platform will be adopted, resolutions addressed, and delegates to the national convention will be elected.
