Report from the August Meeting of the King County Democrats

The meeting began at 7:15 p.m. Rich Irwin's chair report focused on the general election. He urged us to find four people who don't vote and get them to do so, and to seek out volunteers to help make electoral gains this year. He has contact information for the 110,000 precinct caucus attendees and will reach out to them.

We were to have pro/con presentations on both initiatives I-1491 (Extreme Risk Protection Orders) and I-732, Carbon Tax, but neither passed. Motions to support a A recommendation of "NO" for both initiatives also failed.

We heard the pro I-732 position from Greg Rock, a lobbyist from Carbon WA, and the Anti position from Jeff Johnson, President of the WA State Labor Council. While both speakers support the goal of lowering carbon emissions, they differed on potential state tax losses that I-732 may create and the initiative's ability to bring clean energy alternatives to market. A vote to endorse failed, as did the proposal for a Vote NO recommendation.

Candidate endorsements began with a vote on a slate of the Endorsement Committee's recommended candidates. State Representatives endorsed in this manner were Zack Hudgins (11th) Mike Pellicciotti (30th) Cindy Ryu (32nd, Mia Su-ling Gregerson (33rd, Gael Tarleton (36th) Linda Wright (39th) and Brooke Valentine from the 47th

Treasurer Karen Chilcutt was unable to attend the meeting, so Marcee Stone gave us an update. Our approximate balance is \$11,914, \$1,137 of which came from the South King County Spaghetti Dinner.

Joe McDermott thanked the membership for their support in his run for the 7th Congressional District primary race. He urged us to work with him on campaign finance reform and gun violence and to to overturn Citizens United. Locally, he asked us to pass transit upgrades.

Les Treall spoke about the effort to expand our margins in the State Senate and House. Here in the 34th we do quite well but some other districts don't have the same advantage we have and could use our help. Resolution Asking Seattle City Council to Budget for School Construction

Whereas, Seattle is experiencing unprecedented population growth, and Seattle Public Schools (SPS) has consistently increased enrollment by about 1,000 students annually since 2010; and,

Whereas, Seattle is critically and urgently short hundreds of permanent classrooms, with insufficient funding for this capital gap, at great and immediate cost to the quality of education outcomes; and,

Whereas, basically all previously surplus permanent classroom space has been reclaimed, and SPS teaches about 4,800 students in 200 "temporary" portable classrooms; and,

Whereas, Seattle needs approximately 350 more classrooms to lower class sizes to 17 students in grades K-3, as required by Washington state basic education laws; and,

Whereas, a voter-approved program for quality preschool education is requesting space in SPS school buildings; and,

Whereas, the 2016 SPS capital levy is mainly directed to the maintenance backlog and is not intended to address enrollment growth and class-size reduction needs; and,

Whereas, Seattle is experiencing a 40,000-unit housing boom with no plans to add schools to accommodate this growth; and,

Whereas, the Growth Management Act (GMA) empowered local jurisdictions to impose developer impact fees so that growth pays for growth, and these fees are an essential source of school construction funds in most other growing Puget Sound cities; and

Whereas, according to King County "Countywide Planning Policies," the City is required "[to] Plan, through a cooperative process between jurisdictions and school districts, that public school facilities are available to meet the needs of existing and projected residential development consistent with adopted comprehensive plan policies and growth forecasts..."; and,

Whereas, developer impact fees are a vital and necessary funding source for SPS school construction;

Therefore be it resolved that we urge the Seattle City Council to recognize this capacity crisis and to pass a developer impact fee ordinance dedicated to funding Seattle public school construction.
