In Case You Missed Our Last Meeting...



First we heard from candidates: Pete Holmes is running for his third term as City Attorney. Bob Hasagawa, State Senator from the 11th LD, asked us for his endorsement for Mayor. John Urquhart is running again for Sheriff to continue the progress in the culture of his office. Dow Constantine, Lorena González, Liz Giba and Nancy Tosta also requested our endorsement.

Councilmember Lorena González

Lisa Plymate and Chris Porter gave us an update from the April 22 State Committee meeting in Walla Walla. Lisa told us that the State Party is in good hands with Chair Tina Podlodowski. A new meeting system is in place that makes more time for committee work. Lisa is on the Election and Endorsement Committees, and Chris is Co-Chair of the Affirmative Action committee. The Heroes' Narrative from Fuse Washington is being utilized as it recognizes the value of messaging, and not just the recitation of facts and figures. We as a party need to take a page from the GOP's playbook and create a narrative. The State Party budget has leapt from \$2,000 to \$17,000 a month. And, if someone is a good Democrat and is prepared to run, the party will support them. Every race matters.

We learned how this first year of the Democracy Voucher program is performing from Program Manager Rene LaBeau. The goals are to increase the number of people contributing to campaigns. and to increase the number of people running for office. As of the May 10 meeting, 3 candidates have qualified for vouchers and 8 more are in the process of being so. June 2nd was the deadline to apply. There were also 3,300 unique contributors and \$200,000 paid to candidates as of May 10.

In total, 2 million vouchers were sent out in January, and there will be announcements coming soon on how to replace them if lost.

In his Chair's report, David Ginsberg informed us that after consultation with County and State parliamentarians that the April Meeting's endorsement vote for Seattle City Council Position 8 was illegal according to the bylaws. Going forward, candidates must attest that they are Democrats to be eligible for endorsement consideration

We resumed the endorsement for Council Position 8 from the April meeting. Declared Democrats Teresa Mosqueda, Hisam Goueli

and Sara Nelson were nominated. Supporters of Jon Grant urged a no-endorsement position, as Grant would not declare as a Democrat. **Mosqueda** received our sole endorsement.

A slate of candidates seeking re-election was then endorsed:

King County Executive - **Dow Constantine**

KC Sheriff - John Urquhart

Seattle City Attorney - Pete Holmes

Seattle Position 9 Councilmember - Lorena González

KC District 5 Councilmember - Dave Upthegrove

Burien City Councilmember - Nancy Tosta

North Highline Fire Commissioner - Liz Giba

Port of Seattle Position 3 - Stephanie Bowman

John Persak received our endorsement for Port Position 4 out of a field that also included Jacob Richardson and Brooks Salazar. Our endorsement for Port Position 1 went to **Ryan Calkins**, winning out over Norman Sigler and John Creighton.

David Mann was endorsed for Washington Court of Appeals Position 1.

Three additional Burien City Council candidates were endorsed: **Krystal Marks**, Position 7, **Pedro Orguin**, Position 1 and **Jimmy Matta**, Position 3.

Our membership for 2017 is now stands at over 500.

Let's show by example what it means to be a Democrat and why it matters.




34th Dems Cook Book Project Needs Your Recipes


