Chair's Message for August

State of the 34th

Fellow Democrats,

At our August meeting, we'll turn our focus to the State of the 34th. If I were to write my Chair's Report today, it would be a mixed review: we're strong on membership but on the financial front - and we all know how important that unfortunately is in politics - we're not doing as well. We're just over halfway through the year and have raised less than half of our budgeted income. With the urgency of the fight ahead we need to grow our party and its reach and influence in every district and every election in this nation, including right here in the 34th. We set some aggressive targets when we put together the budget because the need is so great and people recognize the urgency and want to stand up and lock arms with us and make clear we won't permit a bunch of oligarchs to dismantle our democracy, disenfranchising American citizens and destroying the planet.

This is a fight between totalitarian capitalism and democracy

The radical right has worked with the worst, most sociopathic owners of capital for half a century to make irrevocable systemic changes that will undermine and eventually allow them to dismantle our democracy. They've attacked our public education system, the foundation of a stable and functioning democracy. They've eroded public faith in government and public institutions while raising the profile of corporations. They've even debased science, facts and knowledge. And they now control the federal government, save some of the lower courts and the resistance inside the federal government.

This isn't just a national phenomenon

The national Republican party and Koch brothers who funded independent expenditure campaigns are pouring tons of money into the 45th LD. They need to

In Case You Missed Our Last Meeting...

Our July meeting was the follow-up to the mayoral "Showdown in the 34th", won by Jessyn Farrell. The main task of the meeting was picking an endorsee. Four of the candidates who participated in our June forum were placed into nomination: Farrell, Bob Hasegawa, Jenny Durkin and Cary Moon. Only Farrell and Hasegawa were present.

Joe McDermott spoke to the nomination of Durkin, noting her stand against the Trump travel ban.

Marlene Allbright spoke for Hasegawa, reminding us that his was one of only two votes against the Boeing tax relief package. Chris Porter urged us to consider one of the three women candidates, since there hasn't been a female mayor since the 1920's. Chris was countered by Ivan Weiss by saying that Hasegawa would be the first mayor of Asian descent.

Grace Stiller spoke on behalf of Farrell and pointed out her experience in areas of transportation and land use.

Finally, a supporter of Moon spoke to what he called her "proven record on progressive issues".

The voting took four rounds:

The first balloting eliminated Moon.

Hasegawa, with Farrell and Durkin in a tie, went to the second round, with Durkin being eliminated in that balloting.

The third round went in favor of Hasegawa, but he failed to meet the 60% endorsement threshold.

Our last round of balloting left us with both Hasegawa and Farrell as our dual endorsees.

Joe McDermott told us about the proposed Veterans and Seniors Levy planned for the November ballot. This is a levy renewal that would cost property owners 10 cents per \$1,000 of property valuation. The funds would be split into thirds, with one-third each going to support veterans, general human services and seniors...an addition to the previous levy.

We also heard from Alexandra Vekich, telling us of the De-escalate Washington initiative, I-940. This initiative would require new police training and tactics to better de-escalate potentially violent confrontations. It would also amend current standards for justifiable use of deadly force by adding a "good faith" standard. It also requires independent investigations. After discussion, the body voted to endorse the signature-gathering effort for this initiative.

School Board member Leslie Harris told us that there is a Seattle School District budget deficit and that is particularly affecting special education and English language learners. The district is also facing a capacity problem, and that the capital budget is being "held hostage" in the state legislature. She also told us that the board is pushing back against the district over waitlists to get into specific schools. As to an additional issue, the board will be looking at the inequitableness of some schools being able to bring in extra staff through donations.

Treasurer Gina Topp announced the we now have 560 members.

move as quickly as they can, before local groups have a chance to organize a large enough resistance to beat them. And that's exactly what we need to continue doing right here in the 34th: making sure we elect and retain the talented and Democratic candidates our communities produce by giving campaigns the boost they need to GOTV and win elections. And that's where you come in.

We can do this together, and together we will win

Our biggest fundraiser of the year is less than 2 weeks away: a resistance-themed Carnival and Live Auction BBQ at Dakota Place Park on August 11th from 7-10PM.
