#### In Case You Missed Our May Meeting...

Two main segments made for the program of the May meeting. After the initial reports and acknowledgments of officials, and first-time attendees we heard from our representatives as they relayed their accomplishments in the legislative recently concluded session. "Majorities matter" was the unofficial theme of their report.

First up was our freshman senator, Joe Nguyen. He paid respect to Reps. Eileen Cody and Joe Fitzgibbon as he made note of his hectic first legislative session. He is proud of the \$47 million for capital projects that is to come to the 34th district: Money for South Seattle College, Mary's Place, traffic improvements in White Center, and for Madison Middle School. In addition, the legislature approved \$188 million that will go into the ferry system for new boats. He was pleased with the vacation of marijuana state convictions, an accomplishment made in conjunction with Rep. Fitzgibbon. The REIT property tax was made more progressive, lowering the tax for 80% of property owners. Return ballots are now postage paid going forward.

Rep. Eileen Cody presented successes in health care legislation. It was a "big year for mental health" as Democrats and Republicans worked in unison in an unprecedented manner. The opioid epidemic across the state served as a catalyst in bringing the parties together to address that problem, and for increased funding for mental health including a new training hospital to be sited on the University of Washington campus. A bill that will give individual insurance purchasers a public option starting in 2021 was passed, dubbed "Cascade Care". Cody said that it is hoped that the option will bring down the cost of individual plans. Another bill was passed that killed the personal exemption from vaccination. Eileen was a bit gleeful as she recounted that she "got to shut down RFK Jr.", a noted vaccine skeptic, who came to Olympia to speak against the bill. A tax on vape products was also passed. And overtime for nurses was approved.

Rep. Joe Fitzgibbon said it was the most intense session in his 9 years in Olympia, and it was by far the most progressive session he's seen...the work we've done to elect progressive candidates in other LDs over the past few years is paying off. Legislation moved quickly; moderates and progressives worked together much better than in the past. Joe ran quickly down a list of accomplishments. Robbery 2 will no longer count as a 3rd strike, affecting the lives of 60 people sentenced to life in prison due to that offense. The detention of youth for status violations was eliminated to ease the pressure at-

risk youth face. In the educational realm, we now have tuition free higher education for those coming from families that make less than the median income. Standardized tests will no longer be required for high school graduation, and local levy lids have been raised. On the environment, we will move to 100% clean electricity. The state is banning hydrofluorocarbon, a powerful greenhouse gas, with the phase-out starting in 2020. Incentives for green transportation are being improved. Governor Inslee also signed an "orca package" of bills: Require more whale watcher keep-back distance, restrictions on pollutants, and protections of fish habitat with stricter enforcement. Tankers will be required to have tug escort.

The second part of the meeting program was a Burien City Council Candidate Forum, moderated by LAC

Chair Jordan Crawley and Vice Chair Rachel Glass. Two candidates were present. Sofia Aragon is running for Position 6, a seat that is being vacated by Austin Bell. Omaha Sternberg is running for Position 4. Another Position 4 candidate, Kevin Schilling, was unable to attend. A progressive candidate for Position 2. Cydney Moore, was unable to participate as she does not identify as a Democrat.

Issues of affordability and increasing homelessness were frequently brought up, as the Burien area is growing. Burien has many ethnic groups with language differences that need to be brought into the decision process. Climate change and its effects on the shoreline will also need to be dealt with in the coming years. See the video on our Facebook page of the May meeting to watch the forum.

A resolution to oppose new and expanded gas infrastructure in Washington State was presented to the body. There was discussion around whether it was still a timely issue, as Governor Inslee had just signed a bill that banned fracking and issued a statement against LNG and methanol production in the state. Marcee Stone-Vekich argued that the state party's environmental caucus and unions involved with facilities construction and overseas shipping should be allowed to have input regarding the remaining issues the resolution addressed. Chris Porter felt that the appropriate committees of the state party should be given the chance to rework the resolution. Speaking in favor was Emily Hazelton from 350 Seattle and Elena Perez. The resolution was passed as submitted.

We heard from 2 representatives from UFCW 21, who came to give an update on the New Seasons grocery chain. New Seasons, though they present an environmentally friendly face to the public and claim to be for worker rights, but the company is aggressively anti-union. One of the speakers, an exemployee, asked us to keep the pressure on them.

Seattle Public Utilities issued certificates of appreciation to individuals who took part in the AdoptA-Street program the 34th is taking part in. Outreach Co-Chairs Karen Richter and Steve Butts handed out the awards to those volunteers that were present.

Two new PCOs were approved. Jen Nye is in 1527 and Carla Rogers recently moved into precinct 1257.
